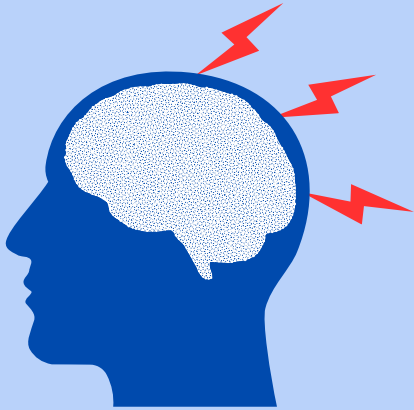


Cannabis-Induced Psychosis

4X

HIGHER RISK OF PSYCHOSIS



Daily use of strong cannabis makes psychosis **4X** more likely. Using it often or starting young raises the risk.



A 2024 study found that teens using cannabis are **11X** more likely to develop a psychotic disorder compared to teens who don't.



Guardians should have open conversations about the risks associated with cannabis and look for any behavioral or emotional changes.



Teachers and school personnel should know the signs of cannabis-induced psychosis in teens, so they can provide resources (listed below).
